Eligible Projects

 Qualifying last-mile broadband infrastructure to unserved 25/3 Mbps or less and underserved between 25/3 and 100/20 Mbps locations

Eligible Applicants

- Cooperatives
- Nonprofit Organizations
- Public-Private Partnerships
- Private Companies
- Public or Private Utilities
- Public Utility Districts
- Local Governments

Eligible Areas

Each county will be designated as a separate application area

Eligible Costs

- Construction, improvement, and/or acquisition of facilities and telecommunications equipment, including infrastructure for backhaul, middle and last-mile networks, and multi tenant buildings
- Long-term leases of facilities to provide qualifying broadband service, including IRUs
- Deployment of internet and Wi-Fi within an eligible multi-family residential building
- Network software upgrades
- Engineering design, permitting, and work related to environmental, historical, and cultural reviews
- Personnel costs, including salaries and fringe benefits for staff and consultants
- Training for cybersecurity professionals working on BEAD-funded networks
- Workforce development including Registered Apprenticeships and pre-apprenticeships, and community college and/or vocational training for broadband-related occupations

Selection Criteria

Scoring (maximum of 75 points): Primary criteria

- **Minimal BEAD Outlay (up to 40 points):** Points awarded to projects within a certain percentage of cost model benchmark, up to 10 points for proposals with higher match
- Affordability (up to 20 points): Most affordable price for 1/1 Gbps service
- **Fair Labor Practices (up to 15 points):** Points awarded to applicants with no labor/employment violations and commitment to fair labor practices

Secondary criteria

- Speed Deployment (up to 1 points): Service available under four-years
- Community/Local government/Tribal government support (up to 10 points):
 Points awarded based on extent of support documented
- Percentage of unserved locations (up to 10 points): Points awarded to projectscontaining higher percentage of unserved locations
- Low-cost \$30 per month residential service (up to 4 points) awarded for commitment to offer \$30 per month service to low-income households.

Selection Criteria (cont'd)

Non-Priority Broadband Projects Only

Priority criteria

- Minimal BEAD Outlay (up to 40 points): Points awarded to proposals that fall within a
 cretain percatage of the cost model benchmark, up to 10 points for proposals with higher
 match.
- Affordability (up to 20 points): Most affordable total price for 100/20 Mbps
- **Fair Labor Practices (up to 15 points):** Points awarded to applicants with no labor/employment violations and a commitment to labor practices

Secondary criteria

- **Speed Deployment (up to 1 points):** Service available under four-years
- Community/Local government/Tribal government support (up to 10 points):
 Points awarded based on extent of support documented
- Speed of Network and Other Technical Capabilities (up to 10 points): Points awarded based on speed of network and sufficient capacity (4 points), scalability (3 points), and cost-effective future upgrade and capital investment path (up to 3 points)
- Lower-cost \$30 per mont residential service (up to 4 points): Awarded for commitment to offer \$30 per month service to low-income households.
