Eligible Projects

 Projects deploying qualifying last-mile broadband infrastructure to unserved (25/3 Mbps or less) and underserved (between 25/3 and 100/20 Mbps) locations. Applicants must propose to serve at least 95% of the unserved and underserved locations.

Eligible Areas

- Application areas will be defined as Zip Code Tabulation Areas (ZTCA)
- DHCD has posted eligible locations to the <u>Open Data Portal</u>

Eligible Costs

- Construction, improvement, and/or acquisition of facilities and telecommunications equipment, including infrastructure for backhaul, middle and last-mile networks, and multi tenant buildings
- Long-term leases of facilities to provide qualifying broadband service, including IRUs
- Deployment of internet and Wi-Fi within an eligible multi-family residential building
- Network software upgrades
- Engineering design, permitting, and work related to environmental, historical, and cultural reviews
- Personnel costs, including salaries and fringe benefits for staff and consultants
- Training for cybersecurity professionals working on BEAD-funded networks
- Workforce development including Registered Apprenticeships and pre-apprenticeships, and community college and/or vocational training for broadband-related occupations

Selection Criteria

Scoring:

Priority Criteria: Competing applications within the same project area, the application with the lowest grant request will be selected

Secondary Criteria (100 points): Applications within 15% of the lowest grant request for the same application area the following scoring will be applied

- 25 points Speed to Deployment
- 25 points Speed of Network & Other Technical Capabilities
- 50 points Provisionally selected subgrantee from the first Initial BEAD application cycle
